Curriculum Update:

Reading: Next week we will launch our workshop with lessons about what we are doing during Reader's Workshop time and what student expectations are for mini-lessons, independent reading, conferences, and partner sharing.

Writing: Next week, we will begin generating true small moment stories by thinking of a person or place that matters, then we'll brainstorm small moments spent with that person or at that place. We have already created our "Heart Maps."

Math: This week we worked on Math 4 Today. We also worked on collecting classroom data to make bar graphs about our class. We started Chapter 1 of our Math Book: Addition and Subtraction Within 1,000.

Science- Students worked in small groups to save a hapless gummy worm named Fred who had managed to capsize his boat and lose his life preserver. The problem? The life preserver was stuck under the boat. Students worked to plan a way to get Fred inside the life preserver. They could not touch the worm, the boat, or the life preserver with their fingers. The only tools they could use were 4 paper clips.
